# Objective 1

# Promoting awareness of the available relevant support & advice networks serving Yorkshire & Lincolnshire.

At our premises on Chamberlain Road, Hull, we have a wealth of information, including a resource library of local and national charities/organisations for anyone to access.

Also coming under Objective One is our Breast Awareness Campaign. Being breast aware is important for both women and men. Knowing the signs and symptoms to look out for and knowing where to go if you are concerned is vital in assisting an early detection which could mean a simpler more effective treatment.

Our Breast Awareness Team attended 13 events this year which included 7 talks to various groups around the region.

Larger events held at various shopping centres and local markets, helped to spread the breast awareness message and the importance of attending breast screening. During 2016/17 our team spoke to thousands of people and gave out 5,023 information leaflets.



# Objective 2

# Raising funds for breast cancer research and treatment.

As a Charity we also under take fundraising in support of causes concerned with breast cancer.

We have donated funds towards an accuvein machine; a nipple tattooing machine; lymphodema assist equipment; and towards Tomosynthesis software technology.

Recently we were delighted to see the Tomosynthesis equipment is now up and running and we are proud to have been a small part of that, in the knowledge it may prevent unnecessary biopsies in healthy patients or assist in the earlier detection of breast cancer. We at HER Breast Friends understand how important this is.







# Objective 3

# Helping create a positive view and environment for all affected by breast cancer.

Of all our objectives, this is probably what HER Breast Friends is best known for. We run a range of services and activities including:

#### **Patient Gift Packs**

We know from our own experiences that going into hospital for surgery can be a difficult and frightening time. Our Patient Gift Packs let people know they are not alone and we are here if they need us. Purchased from fundraising and donations, the contents added from experience and feedback are kindly distributed by the staff caring for them on the ward. Feedback tells us these are very much appreciated.

This year we added a Dammit Doll to accompany the heart shaped cushion, both lovingly made by our craft club. The cushion is used as a simple form of relief to patients after surgery to rest their arm or head and is great for use when travelling home to cushion the weight of the seat belt. The Dammit Doll offers a harmless way of releasing stress!

## Thank you for the fabulous gift bag I received after my surgery. The items were a very welcome gift, which made me smile and feel not so much alone. I used the comfy cushion on the way home in the car under the seat belt.





# The Wig Bank

The Wig Bank at HER Breast Friends celebrated **10 years** of service to the local community and continues to go from strength to strength. It is run by volunteers and is open to all cancer and hair loss clients.

Donated wigs are washed and conditioned and can be obtained for a suggested donation of £10. Breast cancer patients attending the Wig Bank also receive a free Wig Starter Pack to care for their wig. These packs purchased by the Charity have a retail value of around £24.00 per pack and again are funded by fundraising and donations. 120 wigs were supplied by our Wig Bank form November 2016 to end of October 2017.

# **Buddleia Complementary Therapies**

We continue to offer a wide range of complementary and beauty therapies, including Reiki, reflexology and massage, facials, manicures and pedicures. 429 therapies were given between November 2016 and October 2017 by the Lead and volunteer therapists in our warm, comfortable dedicated therapy room.

#### Craft Club

The therapeutic benefits of arts and crafts for those affected by cancer is well documented. Each Wednesday afternoon between 1pm - 2.30pm our Craft Club meet at our premises on Chamberlain Road, Hull and engage in various activities from knitting and crochet, to card making and our Patient Gift Pack cushions and Dammit Dolls.

Everyone is welcome to join in and learn a new craft, or sit, watch and chat over a drink. Alternatively, there's the option of a quiet read from our extensive book bank.

# Pink Pamper Day

Our annual flagship event, The Pink Pamper Day, caters for up to 100 local breast cancer patients, providing a free day of beauty and complementary therapies, inspiring workshops, lunch, relaxation and encouragement. Many friendships have been formed on these days.

April started with the celebration of ten years of the Wig Bank service in the local community, After a lovely revamp of the room, the newly improved Wig Bank was relaunched.

As our flagship event, there is an incredible amount of preparation needed to make sure it is the perfect day, but all the hard work is so worthwhile just to see the smiles on people's faces!

July wouldn't be the same without the miles of pink bras strewn over the grounds at The Lawns in Cottingham for our family fun day 'The Breastival'. This year saw the surprise visit of non-other than David Meyler and his family, who then kindly agreed to draw the winning tickets for our Grand Raffle Draw.

October is National Breast Awareness Month and once again saw us at St Stephens Shopping Centre and North Point Shopping Centre continuing to promote breast awareness and the Charity. October also saw our 2nd Pink Butterfly Walk, with many people braving the weather whilst sporting pink butterfly wings to walk the famous 'Hull Fish Trail'.

# Structure, Governance and Management

Hull & East Riding Breast Friends is a registered Charity and a member of the Fundraising Standards Board. The Charity is an unincorporated association and its governing document is a constitution.

Applications from prospective trustees are put forward to trustee meetings and then elected by the membership at the AGM.

#### **Organisational Structure**

The board members are all trustees and include officers of the Charity. All have a duty to act in the best interests of the Charity. The board meets every 4 – 6 weeks and any sub-committees meet regularly during the year. All members of the board and sub-committees are volunteers. The board delegates the day-to-day running of the affairs of the Charity to the Charity Manager, Jayne Beck who is employed by the Charity, and is assisted by a small team of volunteers.

#### Trustees' Transactions and Declarations of Interest

The group has a duty to disclose any material transactions between the group and the trustees; this would include payments received by themselves for goods and services provided by the group. None of the trustees have had any transactions with the group other than to give their time and skills freely.

#### Risk Management

The trustees assess the major risks to which the Charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the Charity, and continue to take measures to reduce those risks to an acceptable minimum.

#### **Public Benefit**

The trustees believe they have complied with the duty of the Charities Act to have due regard to guidance published by the Charity Commission in respect of public benefit. This is known as the 'public benefit requirement' and the beneficiaries of the Charity must be appropriate to its aims. The trustees have paid due regard to this in deciding which activities the Charity should undertake and how funds are used.

#### Statement on Policy of Reserves

The Charity holds a level of accrued funds because its income is almost entirely dependent on donations. Our policy is to hold sufficient resources to continue the charitable activities of the group for one year.

# **Fundraising & Support**
